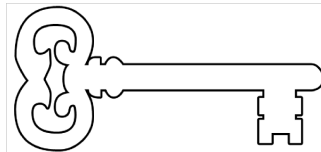

This year we will do a non-perishable goods food drive (canned and boxed) to benefit local food banks.

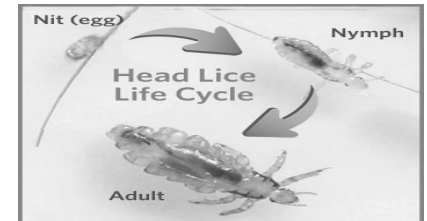
- * **Collection begins Friday Nov. 8th and goes to Thursday Nov. 21st.**

Head Lice

If you suspect your child has head lice, it's important to talk to a school nurse, pediatrician or family physician to get appropriate care. There are a number of available treatments. Please check out the Englewood website for more information.



- Follow treatment instructions of over the counter or prescription treatments. Multiple applications of the same medication is not recommended.
- There is no scientific evidence that home remedies are effective treatments
- Head lice does not infest the house. However, family bed linens and recently used clothes, hats and towels should be washed in very hot water.
- Personal articles, such as combs, brushes and hair clips should also be washed in hot soapy water or thrown away if they were exposed to a person's active headlice.
- Household members and close contacts should be checked and treated.
